

Dr. Sanjeev Ranjan – Profile

Dr. Sanjeev Ranjan before joining NCLT in September 2023 has served as Secretary, Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways for more than 2.5 years and the period saw remarkable improvements the India's World Bank's Ease of Doing Business rankings. The Maritime India Vision 2030 was released during the period with the aim of reducing the logistics cost, making Indian business globally competitive and making the supply chains green and sustainable.

He previously served as Secretary, Ministry of Road Transport and Highways and Chairman, National Highways Authority of India. During his term Dr. Ranjan oversaw large private public infrastructure projects, adopted infrastructure investment trusts and toll operate and transfer for financing, implemented FASTag to make 100% toll plazas electronic toll collection enabled.

Dr. Ranjan worked on national security infrastructure planning as Joint Secretary, Ministry of Defence and Secretary, Border Roads Development Board. He was involved in the restructuring of the Border Roads Organisation with focus on development of strategic projects, that expedited the works on the Rohtang Tunnel, Dorbuk-Shyok-DBO Road and Lipulekh Road. He has also served as Chief Secretary and Additional Secretary & Financial Adviser in the Ministries of Road Transport and Highways, Shipping, and Tourism. He has been on the Board of a number of companies in the power, infrastructure and tourism sectors including Indian Tourism Development Corporation, OTPC, NEEPCO, National Dairy Development Board, Indian Ports Global Ltd. and National Highways Infrastructure Development Company.

Dr. Ranjan received his B.Tech. in Electrical Engineering from IIT, Kanpur, MBA(Finance) from Faculty of Management Studies, Delhi University, and M.Phil.(Economic Development) from University of Glasgow. Dr. Ranjan completed his PhD on the impact of information technology use on efficiency in public sector enterprises at IIT, Delhi. He received a degree in Masters in Public Management at the National University of Singapore. During the program, he was attached to the Monetary Authority of Singapore. Dr. Ranjan studied Financial Institutions at the Harvard Business School as a Lee Kuan Yew Fellow at Harvard University. He is also an alumnus of the National Defence College, New Delhi.
