Spotlight on Suryakumar as India eye series win

Shubman Gill's lean patch has been the talking point but an equally "out of runs" skipper Suryakumar Yadav is also under intense scrutiny as India look to find the right balance and seal the five-match series against South Africa in the fourth T20I on Wednesday.

The third game was an ideal opportunity for Suryakumar to rediscover his touch while India chased a modest 118-run target, but the ease that once made him the top ranked batter in the world was noticeably missing. Shots that defined his dominance have been producing erratic results and the match in Dharamsala was no different as he fell to his trademark pick-up stroke, highlighting a continued struggle.

But he was defiant when it came to self-assessment. "The thing is, I've been batting beautifully in the nets. I'm trying everything that's in my control. When the runs have to come, they'll definitely come. I'm not out of form, but definitely out of runs," Suryakumar confidently said at the post-match presentation ceremony after India's win in Dharamsala on Sunday.

However, the numbers tell

a worrying story. The Indian captain has been searching for fluency for over a year, averaging under 15 in the format this season. Additionally, he's still without a half-century in 2025, the longest such phase of his career. Only twice during this period has he managed to bat beyond 20 balls. With the T20 World Cup less than two months away, the defending champions would want their leader and premier batter to rediscover his rhythm sooner rather than later. Vice-captain Shubman Gill's struggles are as bad if not worse. His elevation to the opening slot has seemingly unsettled India's top order. Gill replaced a well-settled Sanju Samson. The Kerala wicketkeeper-batter was first pushed down the order and eventually dropped despite forming a promising partnership with Abhishek Sharma earlier. Gill has shown his class in other formats, but in T20Is he is yet to come across as the assured batter that he is in Tests and ODIs. While he survived during Sunday's low-target chase, his scratchy run-a-ball 28 did little to ease concerns with seven matches to go before the World Cup.



India have added Shahbaz Ahmed to the squad following Axar Patel's illness-enforced exit from the series, a move that could open the door for Kuldeep Yadav to get an extended run. Jasprit Bumrah, who missed the previous game due to personal reasons, is likely to be available for selection. In his absence, Arshdeep Singh returned to form with

a player-of-the-match performance, while Harshit Rana complemented him well in Dharamsala. "What I have heard is that Bumrah is available. But exactly I don't know. I am not 100 per cent sure," India all-rounder Shivam Dube said on the eve of the match. Fortunes have swung wildly so far in the series. While India dominated and the South Africans looked

completely out of sorts in the lung-opener, the roles were reversed in the next match. South Africa have been comprehensively beaten twice so far and would be eager to win on Wednesday to keep the series alive. Since the T20 World Cup final last June, the Proteas have lost 18 of the 28 matches in the shortest format, highlighting a prolonged phase of inconsistency.

Still searching for a settled combination, the South African team management continues to ring in changes. The constant chopping and changing has contributed to a lack of rhythm in the players and has ultimately cost them many games. The last edition's runners-up side has five matches remaining — two against India and three at home against the West Indies — to finalise the playing XI before its T20 World Cup opener on February 9. Whether the Proteas persist with rotation at the expense of results remains to be seen.

Internal competition key to SA revival: Nortje

Sticking to the basics and drawing from a larger talent pool, fighting for limited spots in the team has led to South Africa's resurgence across formats in the past couple years, according to pacer Anrich Nortje.

Buoyed by historic achievements, including their World Test Championship title and a maiden appearance in the T20 World Cup final last year, the Proteas have re-established themselves as one of world cricket's leading forces. South Africa have carried forward the resurgence in the tour of India as they defeated the hosts 2-0 in the Test series, their first win in the country in 25 years. "The team's been doing unbelievably well. The way they've locked up, there's some fresh faces, there's some old faces, guys have been on the fringes for a while, getting to play more cricket, more consistently," Nortje said on the eve of the fourth T20I against India on Tuesday. Although he has not been part of the Test setup recently, Nortje said the clarity of approach across teams stood out. "I haven't been with the Test team for a while but just coming in and seeing how basic they keep it, trying to be as basic as possible let the moment play out." The fast bowler also attributed South Africa's white-ball success to clearly defined roles and internal competition. "I can only speak for the white ball team, but on the

outside it just looks like the guys are doing really well, getting along very well, and everyone knows their role in the team, and I think that's very important," Nortje said. "There's a lot of competition as well, which creates opportunity and also creates a little bit of pressure for guys in the team, which is good, which is what you want. "I think that's something that's built up over the last year or two as well, and just puts guys under pressure, and a lot of guys have to fight for a spot, which is great, which is what you want." Nortje had been sidelined for an extended period due to a recurrence of a stress fracture but returned to the South African side for the ongoing T20I series, where he has gone wicketless in the two matches he has featured in so far. "It's nice to be back, nice to be back in the Proteas shirt again, really missed it. Sort of happy with the progress, there's still a lot of cricket to play. We go back into some SA20 as well, which is quite a few games back to back." The express pacer said he was focused on gradual improvement rather than instant returns as he continues his comeback. "So, just trying to make progress on every game, trying to improve as much as I can, but just to be realistic as well. So far, I'm really happy with the progress, where I've come to, and just trying to build on whatever I can and whatever I'm working on, going forward into the next month or two." (PTI)

Rahane, Sarfaraz fire Mumbai to three-wicket win over Rajasthan

Ajinkya Rahane's unbeaten 72 and Sarfaraz Khan's brutal 22-ball 73 powered Mumbai to a three-wicket victory over Rajasthan in their Super League Group B match of the Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy on Tuesday. Rahane scored 72 off 41 balls (7 fours, 3 sixes) but it was Sarfaraz who went all guns blazing in yet another chase in excess of 200, clobbering seven sixes and six fours to make 73 off only 22 balls. Chasing 217, Mumbai never took the foot off the pedal and despite losing wickets in a heap they remained on track for another commanding win, overhauling the target with



11 balls to spare with Rahane anchoring the pursuit. Mumbai were undeterred in chase despite losing Yashasvi Jaiswal (15) after a 41-run opening stand with Rahane, who then teamed up with Sarfaraz to put on another 111 off only 39 balls for the second wicket. Sarfaraz fell to Manav Suthar (4-0-23-3) after a whirl-

wind knock laden with powerful hits down the ground which saw Mumbai stutter as they lost wickets in heaps. While Angkrish Raghuvanshi (0) and all-rounders Sairaj Patil (4), Suryansh Shedge (10) and skipper Shardul Thakur (2) failed to give Rahane the support, he found it in Atharva Ankolekar.

Jharkhand seals SMAT final spot

Jharkhand sealed a spot in the Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy (SMAT) final by topping Super League Group A, despite suffering a nine-run loss to Andhra Pradesh on Tuesday. The final Super League Group A match produced a combined 397 runs, the highest match aggregate in T20s involving the two teams. Asked to bat, Andhra produced a collective effort to post 203 for 7 in their stipulated 20 overs and then restricted Jharkhand to 194 for 8 to register a consolation win. However, the victory was not enough as Jharkhand finished atop the table with a net run rate of +0.221, while Andhra ended with -0.113.



Nitish Kumar Reddy emerged as the standout performer for Andhra, smashing a 22-ball 45 and later returning figures of 2 for 32. Andhra raced to 61 in the first five overs with openers Srikar Bharat (35) and Ashwin Hebbar (30) going hard early on. After Ashwin Hebbar and M Hemanth Reddy were dis-

missed in the space of nine balls, Nitish joined the attack, striking six fours and two sixes as Andhra reached 134 for 4 in the 13th over, having lost Bharat in the 10th. Skipper Ricky Bhui contributed a run-a-ball 19, while Pyla Avinash (20) and Saurabh Kumar (16) added valuable runs to help Andhra cross the 200-mark.

Aishwary wins gold with world record in shooting

World Championship silver medallist Aishwary Pratap Singh Tomar delivered a landmark performance at the 68th Shooting Nationals on Tuesday, firing a world record 470.5 to clinch gold in the men's 50m rifle 3 positions final at the Madhya Pradesh State Shooting Range. Aishwary's score is 1.6 points more than the current world record. In simultaneous shotgun action at the Dr Karni Singh Shooting Range in Delhi, Gurjoat Singh produced a composed display to win the skeet men's gold with 55 hits, narrowly defeating nine-time national champion Mairaj Ahmad Khan, who finished second with 54 hits. Aishwary was clinical from the start, equalling his own national record of 597, which he had first achieved at the recently concluded ISSF World Cup Final in Doha, to finish on top of the qualification. Navy shooter Niraj Kumar secured the silver with 463.7, and Uttar Pradesh's Akhil Sheoran completed the podium with 451.8. Defending national champion Kiran Ankush Jadhav finished fourth with 440.0, followed by Paris Olympic



bronze medallist Swapnil Suresh Kusale with 429.7, and his teammate Arjun Babuta in sixth with 414.9. Monu Kumar with 403.2, and Manvendra Singh Shekhawat with 401.6 completed the final line up. Earlier in qualification, Swapnil Kusale (594-33x) finished behind Aishwary followed by Arjun Babuta (594-32x), with Manvendra Singh Shekhawat (591-31x) in fourth position. Akhil Sheoran and Niraj Kumar both shot 589, finishing fifth and sixth on inner 10s, while Monu Kumar (589-28x) was placed seventh and Kiran Ankush Jadhav (588-32x) secured the final qualification spot in eighth. Gurjoat Singh claimed the gold medal in the men's skeet final with 55 hits, edging out Olympian Mairaj

Ahmad Khan, who settled for silver with 54 hits at New Delhi. This was Mairaj's 26th

podium at the National Shooting Championship Competitions. He had earlier topped the qualification round with 122 hits, finishing level with Parampal Singh Guron but securing the top rank after a shootout, where he scored +11 against Parampal's +10. Harmehar Singh Lally claimed the bronze medal in the senior category with 43 hits and followed it up with the gold in the junior finals. Angad Vir Singh Bajwa finished fourth with 35 hits, followed by Parampal in fifth with 24 hits and Jyotiraditya Singh Sisodiya in sixth with 16

hits. In the qualification round, Gurjoat was placed third with a score of 121, while Harmehar finished fourth with 120. Angad (+4) and Jyotiraditya (+3+2) both hit 119 targets and advanced to the final after a shootout. Harmehar claimed the gold medal after a commanding performance, topping the qualification round with a score of 120 before going on to register 54 hits in the final. Zorawar Singh Bedi settled for silver with 51 hits, while Jyotiraditya Singh Sisodiya secured the bronze medal with a final score of 40.
