Public Notice

1. In reference to half day sittings at NCLT New Delhi Bench, it is reiterated that a series of earlier notices have been issued by the NCLT regarding the deteriorated condition of Block-3 CGO Complex and the temporary court arrangements. Vide notice dated 03.09.2025 it was informed that Court Rooms V and VI had become unsafe due to severe seepage and structural damage on the eighth floor at Block-3 CGO Complex; the notice dated 03.09.2025 & 04.09.2025 introduced a temporary half-day sitting arrangement at NCLT New Delhi Bench; the detailed notice dated 08.09.2025 provided status updates along with photographs showing ceiling damage, exposed wiring and repair work; the order dated 22.09.2025 adjusted court timings between forenoon and afternoon sessions to optimise limited space; the public notice dated 22.09.2025 recorded concerns raised by the Bar during their inspection of Block-12 regarding access restrictions and basic facilities; and the public notice dated 31.10.2025 highlighted the continued closure of the 8th floor, the slow pace of CPWD repairs, and the pending objections of SSC regarding entry to Block-12.
2. In continuation of earlier notices issued by the NCLT, New Delhi Bench the present status is summarised as under.
3. Block-12, CGO Complex is still not available for use due to objections raised by the Staff Selection Commission (SSC) regarding access to the building. The Hon'ble Delhi High Court, through its orders dated 17.10.2025 and 13.11.2025, directed the Chairman, SSC, to convene a meeting with the Bar Association, NCLT, and other stakeholders to resolve the issue of access to Block-12, CGO Complex. In compliance with these directions, a meeting was held on 13.11.2025 under the chairmanship of the Chairman, SSC, where the matter was discussed in detail. During the meeting, the Chairman, SSC, assured the NCLT and the Bar Association that a decision on the issue would be conveyed shortly. However, till date, no communication has been received from SSC on this matter. As a result, the position regarding access to Block-12, CGO Complex remains unchanged.
4. Further, the renovation work at the Ground Floor and First Floor of Block-3, CGO Complex continues to move at a very slow pace. Despite repeated requests to CPWD to expedite the work, the progress has not improved.
5. In view of these circumstances, the present arrangement of half-day sittings of the NCLT, New Delhi Bench shall continue until further orders.
6. The inconvenience caused to stakeholders, learned advocates and litigants is sincerely regretted but remains unavoidable under the existing constraints.

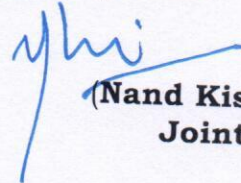

1. 3. During the weekend, in order to ascertain the condition of the court halls at 8th Floor, Block-III, CGO Complex, the false ceiling was dismantled and inspected.
4. During the inspection, it has come to notice that there are extensive cracks in the ceiling and some portion of the ceiling is about to give way. There is a likelihood that a portion or portions of the ceiling may fall down. Iron rods of the ceiling are also exposed, showing extreme corrosion. The details of the same are attached to this public notice for information.
5. NCLT has requested CPWD to make a detailed review of the structural stability and assess the damage.
6. NCLT has further requested CPWD for a safe use certificate for temporary use and till such time the present arrangement as above will have to continue. As and when CPWD takes up the work, the present status of Courts sitting will be reviewed.
7. Further, NCLT has also taken up the work of renovating Block-12, in terms of notice dated 04.09.2025. The Officers/Staff Members of NCLT worked during the weekend from 05.09.2025 to 07.09.2025 i.e. Friday, Saturday and Sunday, to ensure the shifting to Block-12 takes place. The same is being reviewed today i.e. 08.09.2025 by the Hon'ble President, NCLT and the Hon'ble Members of NCLT. As and when the Block-12 premises are made ready and approved as fit for use, two Courts will be shifted to Block-12, CGO Complex. The details of work done by the Officers/Staff Members during the weekend is annexed with this notice for the information of all the stakeholders.

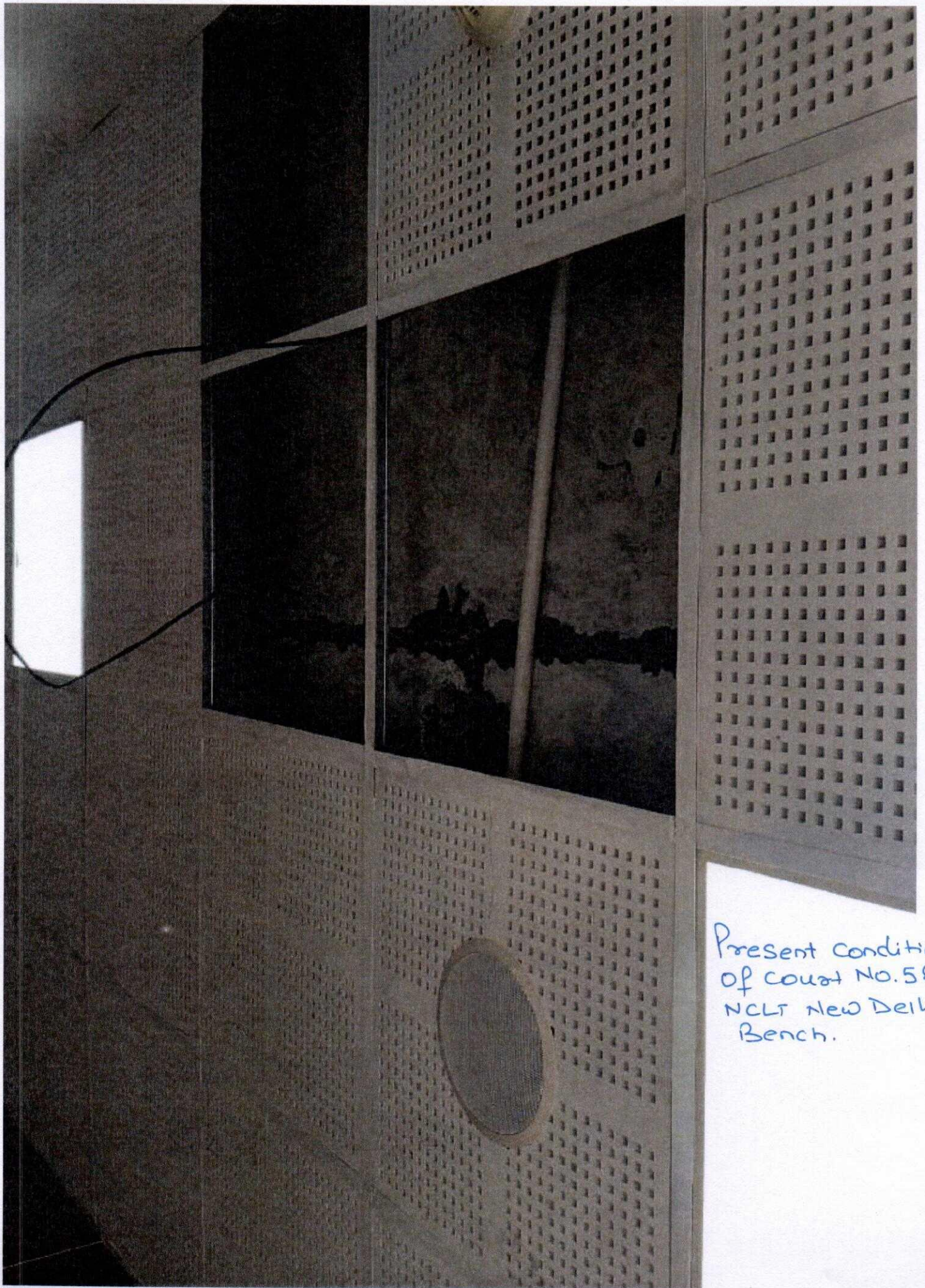

PUBLIC NOTICE

NCLT administration is taking efforts for shifting two Courts i.e. Court-II and Court-III of NCLT, New Delhi from Block-3, CGO Complex to Block-12, CGO Complex consequent to renovation at Block-3, CGO Complex. There are certain issues which needs to be addressed for implementing the process of shifting the two Courts. They are as follows:-

- i. The Air Conditioning System is not functioning efficiently because of long inactivity and NCLT administration found the capacity of the units installed is insufficient at the time of testing.
- ii. The Bar Association was orally informed that the probable date of shifting to Block-12, CGO Complex will be 22.09.2025. The Members of the Bar therefore wanted to satisfy themselves on suitability of the premises for shifting of two Courts to Block-12, CGO Complex.

On their visit, it has come to the notice of NCLT administration that the access to Block-12, CGO Complex, through the main gate nos. 1 and 2 is restricted by SSC and CISF. They are required to use gate no. 3, which does not have lift facility and ramp for disabled persons.

The Members of the Bar expressed their concern that the access to the two new Courts at Block-12, CGO Complex should be similar to Block-3, CGO Complex, through gate nos. 1 and 2. No new pass should be insisted upon.

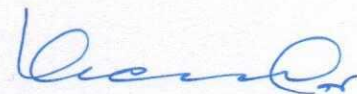
The denial of access through gate nos. 1 and 2 is impeding access to Court. Besides denial of entry through gate nos. 1 and 2 is in violation of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.

- iii. The Members of the Bar once again reiterated their long standing concern that due to the multilayered restrictions of access to CGO Complex and in particular to Block-3 and Block-12, Advocates, Litigants and Stakeholders are facing serious hardship in accessing the NCLT Courts.

This is affecting their right of access to justice. They state that great prejudice is caused to them and to the litigants. NCLT's administration has taken note of the concerns. For the present, NCLT administration is trying to reconcile the issue with SSC and CISF to allow free access to the Advocates, Litigants and Stakeholders as in the case of Block-3, CGO Complex. NCLT administration is working to resolve this issue and start functioning at Block-12, CGO Complex at the earliest.

We request the Bar Association and Litigants to cooperate with the NCLT Administration.

In view of the above, the working of the Courts of NCLT New Delhi will be in terms of the notification dated 19.09.2025 till the issue as above is resolved.

PUBLIC NOTICE

This public notice is issued in response to a number of queries raised with the Registry of NCLT, New Delhi regarding restoration of full day sittings of Courts at NCLT, New Delhi Bench.

NCLT, New Delhi Principal Bench and Five Courts are functioning on half day basis since 03.09.2025. This is due to the shutdown of 8th floor, Block-3, CGO Complex due to the damage of the terrace and roof of 8th floor causing water seepage and in order to avoid electric short circuit. Considering the safety of occupants, the 8th floor, Block-3 has been shut down for repairs by CPWD. The work is yet to start.

For the proper establishment of the temporary Courts at Block-12, CGO Complex, the Secretary, NCLT and Joint Registrar have been given the mandate to ensure smooth shifting & functioning of the same.

In the meanwhile, the NCLT's proposal to shift the two Courts to Block-12, CGO Complex has also met with resistance from SSC on security aspects. A direction has been passed by The Hon'ble First Bench of Hon'ble Delhi High Court as follows: -

"7. We accordingly, direct that the lawyers who have been issued Entry passes by the Ministry of Home Affairs and those

who are issued daily passes shall be permitted to enter the building through Gate no.2 and shall also be able to use any of the two lifts to access the first floor. So far as litigants are concerned, since all the litigants are ordinarily represented by their lawyers we provide that this access shall be available only to the elderly litigants. With a view to finding a long term solution, we request the Chairperson of the Staff Selection Commission to hold a meeting with the representatives of NCLT Bar Association and the Officers-in-Charge of the building of the CGO Complex, Lodhi Road, from the Ministry of Home Affairs to convene a meeting and find out the solution after requisite deliberations.

8. We have been informed that the Bar Association has made a representation on 04.09.2025 to the Ministry of Corporate Affairs to find out a long lasting solution. Accordingly, we direct that an appropriate and well considered decision shall be taken on the said representation within eight weeks.

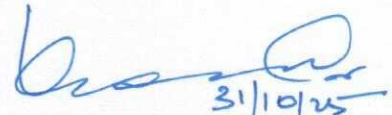
9. We further provide that in case the Ministry of Corporate Affairs intends to seek any clarification and enter into a deliberation with the Bar Association, it will be open to the officer of the Ministry to, accordingly, request the Bar Association for the said purpose.

10. The meeting shall be convened by the Chairperson of the Staff Selection Commission, which shall be attended by the representatives of the Bar, the Officers-in-Charge of the building at CGO Complex, Lodhi Road, from the Ministry of Home Affairs, as also the Registrar of NCLT."

The Staff Selection Commission (SSC) has to call for a meeting as directed by the Hon'ble Court vide order dated 17.10.2025 and the Bar Association has also requested for the meeting urgently. The response of SSC is awaited.

In these circumstances all the six Courts of NCLT, New Delhi are functioning on half a day basis since 03.09.2025. The inconvenience cause to Advocates, litigants and other stake holders is inevitable in the above circumstances.

1. Having regard to the averments made in the application, prayer made therein is allowed.
2. Let the Staff Selection Commission accordingly, be impleaded as party-respondent no.10. The amended memo of parties filed, is taken on record.
3. The application stands disposed of.

4. Issue notice to the newly impleaded respondent no.10, returnable on the next date of listing.

5. Ms. Shiva Lakshmi, learned counsel for the respondents has submitted a brief Note, wherein it has been stated that security personnel posted at Gate no.2 of the building where the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT) is housed, shall be instructed to allow the persons with disabilities and elderly persons including litigants/advocates of NCLT to enter Block 12 through the said gate and use any of the two lifts to access the first floor.

6. Learned counsel representing the Bar Association, however, expresses an apprehension that as per the said Note, only the litigants/advocates of NCLT, who are elderly, alone will be permitted to enter Block 12 through Gate no.2 and use the lifts without the corresponding benefit to advocates who are not elderly but have been issued Entry passes by Ministry of Home Affairs.

7. We accordingly, direct that the lawyers who have been issued Entry passes by the Ministry of Home Affairs and those who are issued daily passes shall be permitted to enter the building through Gate no.2 and shall also be able to use any of the two lifts to access the first floor. So far as litigants are concerned, since all the litigants are ordinarily represented by their lawyers we provide that this access shall be available only to the elderly litigants. With a view to finding a long term solution, we request the Chairperson of the Staff Selection Commission to hold a meeting with the representatives of NCLT Bar Association and the Officers-in-Charge of the building of the CGO Complex, Lodhi Road, from the Ministry of Home Affairs to convene a meeting and find out the solution after requisite deliberations.

8. We have been informed that the Bar Association has made a representation on 04.09.2025 to the Ministry of Corporate Affairs to find out a long lasting solution. Accordingly, we direct that an appropriate and well considered decision



shall be taken on the said representation within eight weeks.

9. We further provide that in case the Ministry of Corporate Affairs intends to seek any clarification and enter into a deliberation with the Bar Association, it will be open to the officer of the Ministry to, accordingly, request the Bar Association for the said purpose.

10. The meeting shall be convened by the Chairperson of the Staff Selection Commission, which shall be attended by the representatives of the Bar, the Officers-in-Charge of the building at CGO Complex, Lodhi Road, from the Ministry of Home Affairs, as also the Registrar of NCLT.

1. This is an application seeking certain clarifications in our order dated 17.10.2025. The application has been moved by the Staff Selection Commission stating that in terms of our aforesaid order, the individuals who are issued daily passes have been permitted to enter into the building through Gate No. 2 and also have been permitted to use any of the two lifts to have



access to the first floor.

2. The submission is that the Staff Selection Commission functions with a large number of employees and access to daily pass holders through the lift is causing some difficulty.

3. Such issues, in our opinion need not engage the Court's attention; rather it is the responsibility and duty of the officer/ official concerned who is otherwise responsible for regulating the access and exit of the building in question. In the aforesaid view of the matter, we require the Commandant of the Secretariat Security Force or any other responsible officer of the Ministry of Home Affairs to hold a meeting to be attended by the Registrar or any other responsible officer of the NCLT and the representatives of the Bar Association today itself during the lunch hours and find a solution.

4. We hope and expect that the officers holding the meeting in terms of this Order shall find out a satisfactory solution which shall ease the entry of the lawyers to the NCLT Court rooms, as also shall take care of the concerns of the Staff Selection Commission.

5. For finding out a long-term solution, it was informed to the Court, which stands recorded in our order dated 17.10.2025 that the Bar Association has made a representation on 04.09.2025 to the Ministry of Corporate Affairs and, accordingly, we direct that an appropriate and a well considered decision shall be taken on the said representation within eight weeks from today. It is also provided that, in case, the Ministry of Corporate Affairs intends to seek any clarification and enter into deliberations with the Bar Association, it would open to the Ministry to request the Bar Association for the said purpose. The meeting to be convened for finding out long-term solution shall also be attended to by the President, NCLT and any other stake holder in



the matter.

6. The application stands disposed of.
